<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. 250gm (1/2 lb) Butter2. 180gm (6ozs) Dark Brown Sugar3. 1 Tablespoon Treacle or Golden Syrup4. 4 Eggs5. ½ cup Sherry, Rum or Brandy6. 1 ½ cups Plain Flour7. ½ cup SR Flour8. 1.25kg Mixed Fruit9. 125gm chopped Almonds and Walnuts (mixed)10. 1 teaspoon EACH Mixed Spice and Ginger	<p>Soak fruit overnight, then add syrup, sugar and beaten eggs. Beat well. Add cooled melted butter and sifted flour and spices. Mix thoroughly. Bake in 20cm round tin, which has been lined with greased paper, for approximately 3 ½ hours, in a slow oven.</p>
