5. Merino Lambs Wool, not to exceed 450g from lamb dropped since April 1st 2021
6. Merino Hogget Fleece
7. Merino Fleece, one, summer shorn
8. Coloured wool, **MUST** be contained in a clear bag

9. Commercial Value Wool

CONDITIONS - Fleeces competing in this award must be specially entered and NOT selected from those competing in general Classes. Fleeces are to be from Merino Ewe and/or Wether sheep, unhusked, unrudded, also to be skirted and of 12 months maximum growth. The Award will be determined on type, uniformity and commercial value.

Any fleeces, which in the opinion of the judges have not properly skirted will be disqualified
